WHO WE ARE

My wife Edwina is a fourth-generation Western Australian. Her ancestors, the Egerton-Warburton's migrated from England and settled in the Frankland River in the mid-1800s.

Not just settlement pioneers, they planted the first vines on the banks of the river in 1875. Unlike Edwina, I'm a first-generation Australian. At school, whilst other kids had meat pies and vegemite sandwiches for lunch, I had roasted pepper sandwiches and homemade sausages. With my uncles and aunts pressing grapes on their farms and in their backyards, and my own family at one time having a small vineyard, it's clear where my interest in wine originated.

We met in 1994, the same year I graduated from horticulture. As I was starting my work in wine, we were also embarking on our life journey. During my career, I've been head winemaker at Houghton and a travelling consultant. I designed vineyards and wineries, and work took me overseas to New Zealand, the USA, France, Italy and South Africa.

Edwina and I purchased our first parcel of land in Frankland River in 2005 with dreams of planting our own vineyard. It was a small parcel that had originally been part of a large, historic land holding called Riversdale. A few years later, we had the opportunity to buy the neighbouring vineyard and acres of prime river and vineyard country. We didn't hesitate as we knew its potential.



A lot has happened since Cherubino began in their spare room in 2005 with the release of one wine.

A lot has happened since. The range of wines has grown, and along the way received a variety of accolades from respected wine critics such as James Halliday as well as various medals and trophies nationally.

Fruit is sourced from the best wine-growing regions of Western Australia including Frankland River, Margaret River and Pemberton. All vineyards are managed in-house by Cherubino with meticulous attention to detail regarding soil and vine management. Larry's wife Edwina grew up in Frankland River in the Great Southern region of Western Australia and her family still farms there today. The Cherubino family spends as much time as possible down in their vineyard, Riversdale. It still feels very much like home.

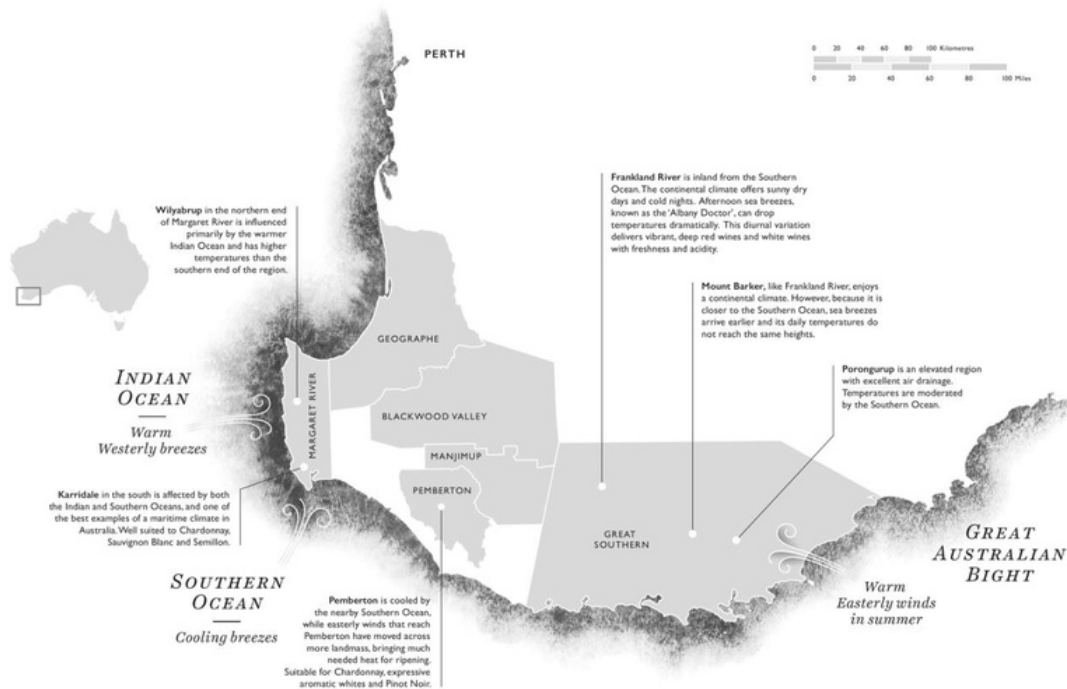
VINEYARDS

With a total area under vine exceeding 120 hectares and more than 60 different varieties and clones, we intend to grow the varietal that best suits the region and place. We place a lot of emphasis on understanding how each varietal performs in different parts of the vineyards. We have the most diverse clonal selection by area in the state for cabernet sauvignon, shiraz and chardonnay.

95% of our fruit is sourced from our own self-managed vineyards located in Karridale and Wilyabrup in Margaret River, Frankland River, Pemberton and Mount Barker. All the sites are managed sustainably, with no herbicides used, and minimal copper employed.

We aim to bring the expression of the site out in every grape we grow. All our wines are carefully crafted to reflect a true sense of place and to express the fruit at its optimum.

“We are committed to provenance: the source of the grapes and the skill of the grower. These are the most important elements to me because winemaking is a conversion process from grape to glass.” - Larry Cherubino

AT CHERUBINO

MARGARET RIVER



From Cape to Cape, Margaret River is around 100 kilometres long and 10 kilometres wide.

North to south, the sub-regions of Yallingup, Carbanup, Wilyabrup, Treeton, Wallcliffe and Karridale all have their distinct characteristics, divided by creeks or rivers in much the same way the appellations of the left bank in Bordeaux are.

Generally, the reds are grown in the warmer northern vineyards of Yallingup, Wilyabrup and Carbanup. Whilst the whites span all areas, they tend to have more verve in southern Margaret River, which is defined by the influences of both the Southern and Indian Oceans, making a very unique climate for Chardonnay and aromatic whites.

WILYABRUP

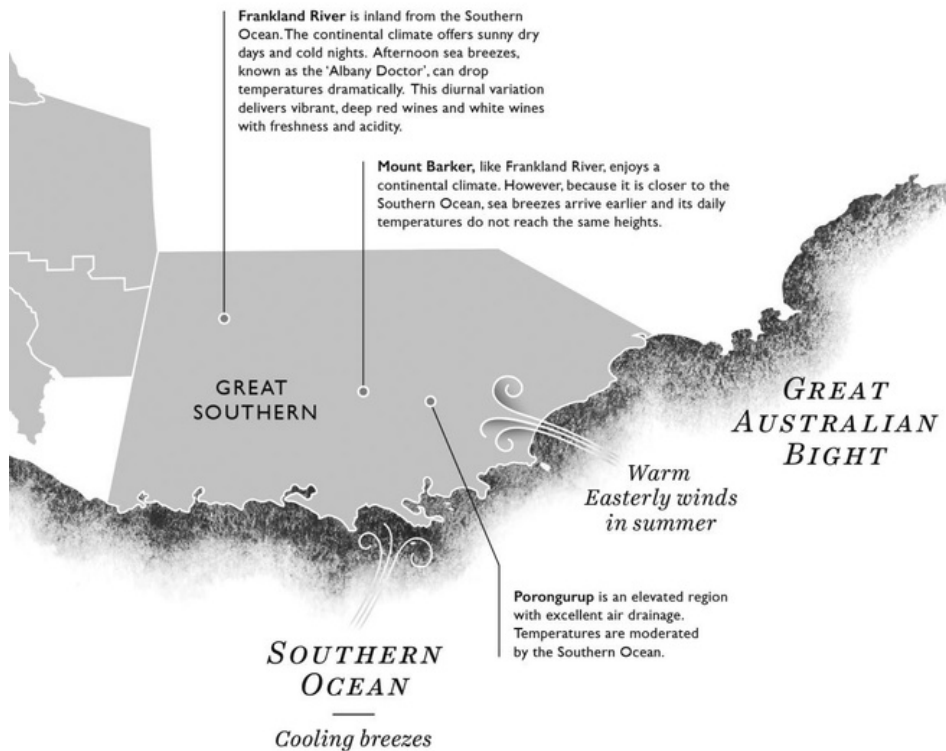
The best soils in the northern part of Margaret River are iron rich laterite loams with a good amount of gravel content, which drain freely and warm up quickly in the spring – vital for later ripening varieties like Cabernet Sauvignon.

At the edge of a national park, right on ocean, the vines of Pedestal vineyard are twenty years of age and sit at the highest point of the Wilyabrup Valley. Here, on top of the hill, there isn't as much loam and the soils are faster draining. Whereas other vineyards in the region are northwest facing, the slopes in this vineyard are south facing. The vineyard doesn't see afternoon heat, and takes longer for the fruit to develop, making more delicate and more intense Cabernets. The vineyard produces finer boned claret blends.

GREAT SOUTHERN



The Great Southern, eight times the size of Margaret River, spans 100 kilometres from north to south and 200 kilometres from east to west. It is the largest wine Geographic Indication in the world. Vast and diverse, the regional climate ranges from the coastal maritime subregions of Albany and Denmark to the inland continental subregions of Mount Barker, Porongurup and Frankland River.

The Great Southern receives cooling easterly winds that have travelled across the water. The continental climate offers sunny but cool dry days and cold nights. The afternoon sea breezes, known as the Albany Doctor, can drop temperatures dramatically. This diurnal variation delivers vibrant and deeply coloured red wine and whites with freshness and acidity.

The region produces around a half of Western Australia's wine show success, but despite this, it is not as heralded as Margaret River. Its potential is immense.

GREAT SOUTHERN

Frankland River

The soils are chiefly iron rich lateritic gravelly or sandy loams derived from granite or gneissic rocks, and so are typically red in colour and of uniform depth. Some areas carry loams derived from the native Marri and Karri eucalyptus forests.

The river valley is a major influence and responsible for cool airflow. There are only a handful of days in the high thirty degrees Celsius. The growing mean temperatures are very mild and warm days are moderated by the Albany Doctor (the sea breeze off the Southern Ocean) which can drop the temperature from 30 to 15 degrees Celsius in a matter of hours.

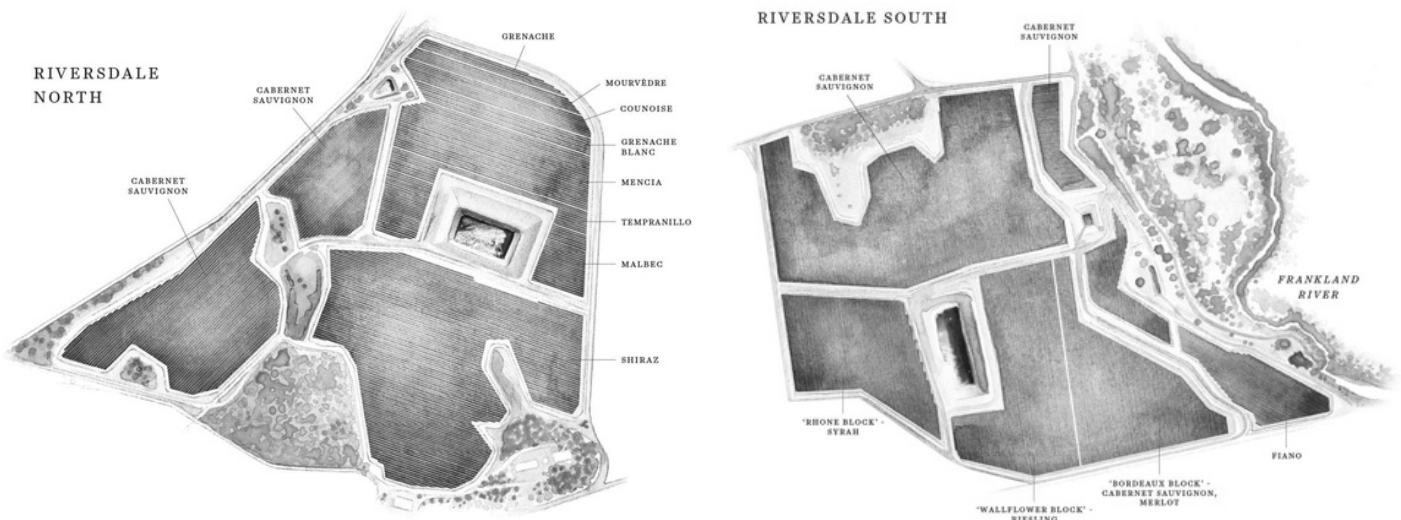
Justin vineyard

Justin Roche planted the Justin vineyard in the 1960's at the southern end of the region close to Rocky Gully. The vineyard has classic Frankland River soils.

With north and south facing slopes, parcels mature over several weeks.

Riversdale vineyard

Originally planted in the mid 1990's, we purchased this vineyard in 2004 and began an extensive renovation, grafting five new clones of Cabernet Sauvignon and five new clones of Shiraz along with Mencia, Touriga Nacional, Grenache, Mourvedre, Malbec, Fiano as well as new clones of Merlot and Cabernet Franc. Riversdale has the greatest diversity of grapes and clones of any vineyard in Western Australia. All the these were grafted onto existing Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz mature vines and the resulting wines are some of the best coming from the property. The vineyard has a great deal of variation in aspect and micro-climates.

AT CHERUBINO

PORONGURUP

Porongurup is an imposing granite range that lies east of Mount Barker, with vineyards that are 150 meters higher than Mount Barker. The Stirling Range, nearby to the north and east, is one of the few places in Western Australia. Coupled with outstanding air drainage, the region is cooler than its neighbouring subregions, and ripens a week later than Mount Barker and two weeks later than Frankland River. It is well suited to cultivars that are sensitive to heat damage.

Pannoo Vineyard

Starting at 350 meters altitude, Pannoo vineyard is one of the highest vineyards in the state. The entire vineyard is a northeast-facing site that enables consistent ripening and receives cooling easterly winds from the nearby Southern Ocean, providing relief from the warm conditions. The soils are primarily granite based with less ironstone and gravel than other parts of the state. Rainfall persists into later spring, aiding vine growth and preparing them for the dry but importantly cool conditions throughout summer. Breaking rains don't fall until late April in the region, giving reds time to fully ripen. Plantings at Pannoo vineyard are Pinot Noir, Shiraz, Riesling and Chardonnay.

MOUNT BARKER

Mount Barker, although only 25 kilometres west of Porongurup, has very different soils and topography. The soils are iron rich lateritic gravelly loams that lay on top of granite or gneissic rock, from which they are formed. In some parts there are sandy loams. The altitude ranges from 50-100 meters above sea level, and the climate can best be described as continental. While summer is relatively moderate, some days can reach up into the mid-thirties, but these are very limited, and the temperatures tend to drop by 15-20 degrees overnight. This day to night diurnal variation has a profound effect on the wines.

ALBANY

Albany's climate is maritime, strongly shaped and moderated by the Southern Ocean; the standard description is that it is Mediterranean, with moist, cool winters and warm, dry summers. Diurnal temperature range is minimal, and moderate humidity in summer assists ripening by reducing stress on the vines. Soil types of the region are either lateritic gravelly, sandy loams or sandy loams derived directly from granite and gneissic rocks.

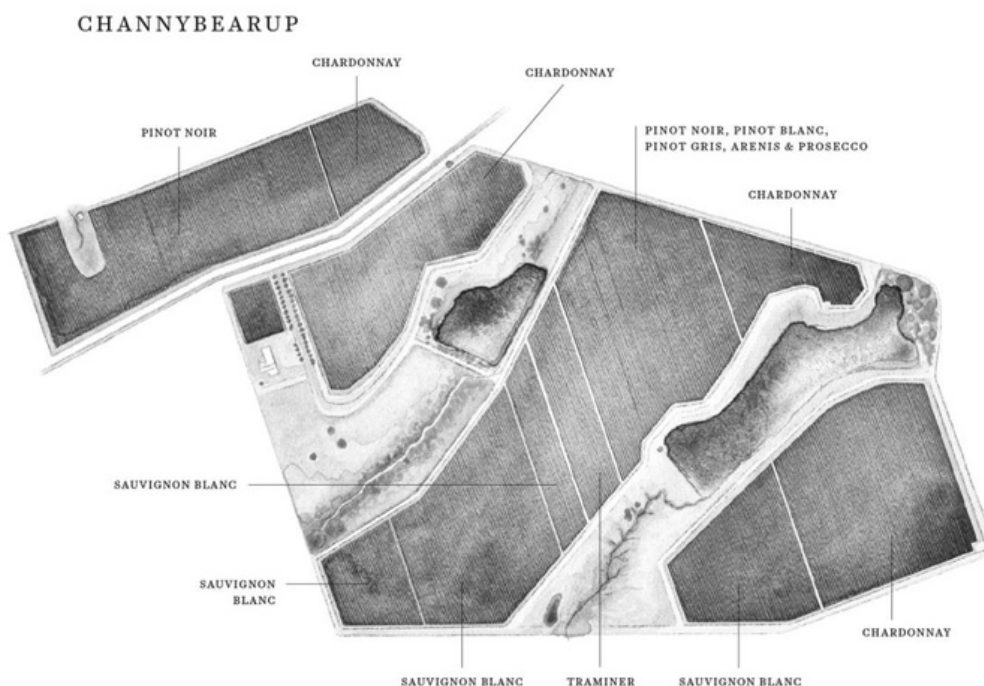
PEMBERTON

Pemberton sits between the Great Southern and Margaret River. It is relatively new as a wine region with the first trial vineyards planted in 1977 following recommendations from the renowned Dr. John Gladstone. Pemberton combines southern latitude with high altitude. Vineyards are at around 100-250 metres elevation and influenced by the Southern Ocean. Winters are cold and wet; summers typically dry and mild with temperatures ranging from 10 to 30 degrees Celsius, making an ideal rainfall pattern for viticulture. Pemberton is an ideal place for white varieties.

Channybearup vineyard

The soils are Karri loams, which are deep, very well drained red soils with deposits of gravel - named after the ancient Karri trees which dominate the forests in the area. All late ripening varieties such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Shiraz have been removed from the vineyard as the season moves into winter patterns in mid to late March, therefore interfering with the ripening.

Over the last ten years the vineyard has undergone some major changes with a real focus on white varieties. Recent plantings include Pinot Blanc, Arneis, Sauvignon Gris, Prosecco as well as new clones of Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Gris and Pinot Noir. The vineyard was planted in 1996, with new plantings continuing to the present day. A majority of the vines are reaching 20 years of age, which is particularly crucial for quality Chardonnay.
